Education Assistance Checklist

The Accountancy Board of Ohio has funds available to reimburse students for tuition based on criteria in the checklist below. Students are eligible for tuition reimbursement once they have earned 120 semester hours (180 quarter hours). Most students are not eligible for tuition reimbursement after they have earned 150 semester hours (225 quarter hours). Eligible full-time students can claim tuition reimbursement for one calendar year; part-time students may have the amounts prorated over a longer period of time.

Students who have completed the coursework to qualify to take the CPA exam are **not** eligible for tuition reimbursement. Most students who have earned more than 150 semester hours (225 quarter hours) are **not** eligible for tuition reimbursement.

It is a two-step process to receive tuition reimbursement. First apply and receive a commitment. Then when you meet the requirements for tuition reimbursement, complete the grant application. The commitment and grant applications are at: http://acc.ohio.gov/CPAExam/Scholarships.aspx

To receive tuition reimbursement, you must be able to answer YES to the following questions.

Do you have an education assistance commitment?

Are you going to take the CPA exam?

Have you earned at least 120 semester hours (180 quarter hours) college credit?

Do you still need coursework to qualify to take the CPA exam?

For in-state tuition at Ohio institutions, are you considered an Ohio resident?

Are you enrolled at an Ohio college or university?

Are you in good academic standing?

Do you make payments to the bursar for course fees?
